Examples of the Difference We Make

SENIORS FIRST HEALTH EXPRESS



Kaiser Permanente is partnering with Seniors First to improve access to care for seniors and the disabled by supporting their Health Express transportation service.

Health Express provides transportation to non-emergency medical appointments for eligible Placer County residents, including the disabled and those over the age of 60.

This program improves attendance for preventative appointments, and helps individuals retain their independence longer.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL FREE CLINICS



Kaiser Permanente is helping to fund two urgent care community clinics run by the St. Vincent de Paul Society of Roseville.

These clinics provide free access to medical

evaluation and prescription medications for urgent medical problems for uninsured and low-income Roseville-area people, including the homeless and undocumented immigrants.

Care is provided at the St. Vincent de Paul Society office and The Gathering Inn.
